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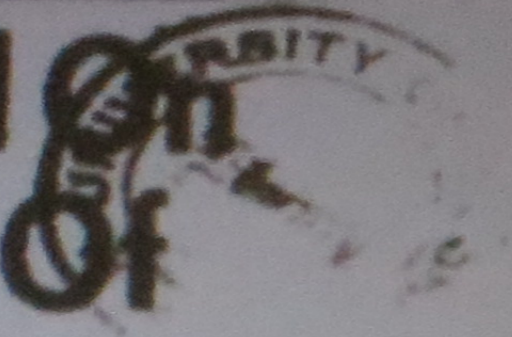
Queens Urged To Call Allens

Dredge Contract Has Already Been Given; Bids Will Be Advertised

Improvements and expansion of berthing facilities at the Naval Station, Key West, will be made this year by Naval Civil Engineers at a cost of about \$2,000,000.

Designs are now being completed for the construction of five finger piers at the Naval Ordnance Depot and the reconstruction of five other piers in the submarine basin.

The utility lines serving existing piers also will be replaced to provide protection from hurricanes. The new piers will be 20 by 125 feet of pavement construction. Dredging work for adequate berthing facilities will be done.

A dredging contract has been awarded to the Atlantic, Gulf and Pacific Dredging Company. They expect to move their equipment in the latter part of March to start dredging operations. Approximately 275,000 cubic yards of dredging will pro-
